## *Centennial Memories* April 9-11, 1999

What a wonderful celebration! For those who attended and even for those who were unable to attend, a new chapter was written in the Waller-Lincoln Park High School history. Beyond a doubt, the spirit of Waller-Lincoln Park lives on in the graduates and in the current students. We hope in this post-Centennial newsletter to give those who attended some record of the events and to show those who were unable to attend what a great weekend it was.

For two years a committee that included graduates, current and past parents, community members and school administrators worked to organize the Centennial Celebration. The Friends of Lincoln Park High School spearheaded the effort and was largely responsible for the incredible effort to gather alumni names and get them into a database. They also published four newsletters which included news notes about alumni. Others began to plan and make arrangements for the activities of the weekend or researched the history of the school. A great deal of publicity resulted in over 3500 names in the database. Eventually, nearly 800 people registered for the Centennial Celebration weekend.

Some of you have renewed twice since we inaugurated the effort almost three years ago and many have donated extra amounts to further the cause. All fees and donations have gone directly to pay postage and newsletter production costs. (See *Finance Report* on page 9.) BRAVO! THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT!

There is no official Alumni Association yet. In fact, the Alumni Group has been functioning as a committee of Friends of Lincoln Park High School. The principle "instigators" are parents of current high school students, many of whom have now graduated. Thus, it is now time to think about an independent Alumni Association. The Friends' Alumni Committee is asking you, the alumni, to make this committee your own. We are currently looking for alumni who want to "step up to the plate" to actively support their high school!

We have truly already accomplished much. The Centennial celebration was highly successful, thanks to the combined efforts of many, including many Waller/LPHS graduates. Historical displays were set up around the school. On-going tours took alumni to many places that looked very different from the way graduates remembered them—such as the former lunchroom that is now a classroom. Each decade (i.e. 1950-59) had a room where graduates from those years could meet and reminisce. A group of graduates from the 1930's set up their own special place in the front hallway. Each person received a commemorative booklet and a souvenir key chain. When the bell rang for lunch, the line stretched the entire width of the building and out the front door. Class photographs were taken in the gym. A chorus concert ended the afternoon with alumni again impressed with the quality of the young performers' work.

In the evening, three reunions plus a faculty party were well attended and provided an opportunity to spend some concentrated time with old friends.

## SUNDAY

A gala brunch brought the festivities to a climax. A beautiful buffet style brunch was set up in the International Ballroom of the Chicago Hilton Towers. Special guests extended their greetings. The student orchestra entertained. Many lingered into that Sunday afternoon, reluctant to have it all end. It was truly a wonder-filled weekend, with happy faces and voices brought together to praise that spirit everlasting, the spirit of Waller-Lincoln Park High School.

After serving in the U.S. Army from 1943-46, he went back to school, eventually obtained a law degree from DePaul University and was admitted to the Illinois Bar in 1949. He had a private practice in downtown Chicago from 1957 to 1972. He was appointed Associate Judge of the Circuit Court of Cook County Municipal District I in 1985. He has had a distinguished career, serving in all sections of the district including civil bench trials, Eviction Court, Traffic Court, Housing Court, Jury Motion Court, Supplemental Proceedings Court, Pro Se Court and several Misdemeanor Branch Courts. He is often called upon to act as mentor for newly elected or appointed judges. He was married to JoAnn B. Nutley and has eight children. ## FINANCIAL REPORT

Your membership fees and donations have made possible this alumni newsletter. Forty percent of the \$9142 total revenue so far (collected from January 1, 1997 until November 5, 1999) has come from \$5.00 Alumni Group membership payments and renewals. Included in this total are additional donations that were specified either as contribution to the Centennial celebration or to newsletter costs.

We made 1600 newsletters in September, 1997 (they were photocopied at the high school, as we lacked funds at that time). We had 2500 printed in the spring of 1998, 5000 in the fall of 1998, and 5000 in the spring of 1999 (the Centennial Issue). This amounted to \$3,373 total printing expense for the first four newsletters.

As for postage, we have non-profit bulk rates when large mailings are done, but some individual newsletters are sent at regular postage rates, as we receive new names or requests. Thus, total postage costs have amounted to \$2,224.

The expense figures are as follows:
