Alumni Meet to Form Independent Organization

On March 15, 2000, during the First Alumni Day (and Middlemarch Open House), almost 50 enthusiastic graduates who had braved terrible weather gathered to reminisce and talk seriously of forming an independent

association for alumni of Waller and Lincoln Park High School. Wallace Heistad and Bill Leaveck, from the classes of January and June 1954, served as moderators. Diane Fritz Peters of the January 1955 class agreed to be secretary of the meeting.

Also present was Bernice Schweichler (35), Waller High School's first homecoming queen.

The discussion concerned the whys and wherefores of organizing and the purpose or mission of such a group. In fact, there was originally an alumni association that was quite active until 1966, and many would like to revive it. Several of the participants expressed the hope that there might eventually be a room in the school that could serve as an "office of alumni affairs" and in which there could be displayed historical memorabilia, pictures and yearbooks. Having such a central organization for alumni would also enable graduates 1) to find old friends and classmates more readily, 2) to put together class reunions, 3) to learn of and maintain pride in continuing accomplishments of the school and its graduates.

Development of an Alumni Association "Constitution" was the focus of business at a subsequent May committee meeting of twelve alumni. These

gatherings were also conducted by Heistad and Leaveck, as the new volunteer alumni representatives to the Friends of Lincoln Park/Waller. Another planning meeting of this committee will be held on November 20th to finalize the proposal.

The proposed constitution will be presented for discussion and revision at a meeting of all interested parties on January 22, 2001 at 7:00 p.m. at Lincoln Park High. Election of officers and Board Members will occur and there will be an opportunity to sign up for committees (such as Membership, Communications, Fundraising, and Special Events) at that time. Notice of the meeting will be sent via the Friends and Alumni Voice Mail, the school web page and phone calls to those who have already attended meetings. We are seeking the greatest amount of input, so all are welcome! We hope to see as many as possible in attendance at this January meeting.

Editorial

Time flies! It has been a whole year since the last Alumni News came out. Things have slowed just a bit since the school Centennial in April of 1999. But much is still happening here, and I want to encourage you all to continue to support your fledgling organization.

You have so much to be proud of as Waller/Lincoln Park graduates: a real legacy of quality, caring, nostalgia—and the special people that you were as high school students, teenagers full of possibility. There also were the teachers and experiences that formed you and gave you dreams. We honor those (long ago?) young people and those dreams. You Waller/LPHS alumni represent almost the whole range of years that make up a lifetime.

The Lincoln Park High of today is still full of potential. The school is a special, wonderful place still—though there are of course problems (as is true for every school!) and though the world is not an easy one for many of the current "crop" of teens (as similarly was the case in your day too). Many types of young people are here: they are a microcosm of society in Chicago's urban environment. They are from so many varied backgrounds: 32% white, 38% Afro-American, 14% Asian, 16% Hispanic. Forty-nine percent are from low-income families, and they come from fifty different countries representing many languages. As freshmen, they are from both private and public schools of all sorts.

In the midst of all this diversity (very similar in many ways to the old Waller High)—and in spite of the inadequacy of funding, the bureaucratic tangles, the lack of resources of all types—there is much learning going on at this school. Though operating on a shoestring budget, LPHS outperforms by far the standard expectations of a typical urban school. Students achieve, and alumni can be genuinely proud of many of today's students—who deserve real admiration for their efforts (please see the "Did You Know?" section, page 6).

Not all of the students do so well. Some are desperate for the right kind of parent and teacher attention, or encouragement from a mentor or tutor. Many could benefit from an effective awareness that someone around them has confidence in them.

We hope you enjoy this issue of Alumni News. If you do, we hope you will be inspired to continue the contact with your alma mater—in some way. It may be as little as joining the Association for the next year (or renewing a membership). Or it could be a more involved contact, such as attending alumni meetings, joining an alumni committee—even volunteering to tutor students in your area of expertise or supporting Friends of Lincoln Park in some way (we definitely need a committed involvement of community members). "Friends of LPHS" tries to help to improve the environment for ALL of the students—and thus to better the "track record" of each of them even more, needless to say! It is certainly worth every effort!

OBITUARY

HILLARY CLAIRE JOHNSON (1975-1999) was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on Aug. 21, 1975. She attended elementary school at The Academy of the Sacred Heart, Ogden Elementary School and Bell School. She entered the International Baccalaureate program at LPHS in Sept. 1989. After graduation, she attended Coe College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, from Sept. 1993 through Jan. 1995. She then returned to Chicago and began working as an editor for Duff and Phelps Credit Rating Company while attending DePaul University in the evenings. She returned to full time study in Sept 1997, majoring in philosophy and graduating from DePaul in 1999 with highest honors. She received a teaching fellowship and entered the masters program in philosophy at the University of Memphis, moving to Memphis in August of 1999. On Saturday, Nov. 20th, when returning from a local grocery store, she was car-jacked outside of her apartment. The search for Hillary began shortly after midnight on the 21st. The story of her disappearance was kept alive by friends and associates in Memphis and extensive media coverage, and numerous law enforcement agencies conducted the search across many southern states. As a result of these efforts, her car was found on November 29th in Walnut, Mississippi. Her body was found on December 4th, just fourteen miles from Memphis. She had been brutally murdered. A suspect has been arrested and charged. Hillary's case may go to trial in Tennessee sometime next year (2001).

Hillary's mother and stepfather, Nancy and Charles McPike, have begun a national foundation to aid families of missing adult children. Cases of missing adults are not treated with the same urgency as those of missing children. We also have 30 Commended Students this year. Of the 1999 semifinalists from Lincoln Park, 20 of the 23 of them became finalists. On average, nationwide, only half of finalists actually receive scholarships, but over the years, two thirds of LPHS finalists have done so.
- that in the 2000 National Achievement Competition honoring outstanding Afro-American students, LPHS has eight semifinalists. We also have four National Hispanic Finalists.
- that LPHS is ranked 69th of 13,000 schools in the nation in the number of Advanced Placement Exams administered in 2000. We are 7th in the 13-state Midwestern Region. AP tests are taken after students complete college

level courses. This year, 456 students took 853 AP exams. In addition, 60 students were named AP Scholars, 37 received the award of AP Scholar with Honor and 33 were named AP Scholars with Distinction.

- that in 2000, Cheryl Cruz-Fernandez (00) was honored as a member of the seventh Illinois High School Association All-State Academic Team. She was one of 26 awardees from 575 nominations. Members of the IHSA All-State Team are chosen for athletic as well as academic ability. In the past three years, four LPHS students have been selected for the All-State Academic Team, including the top-rated student, the Illinois High School Student of the Year. Two students made the Tribune's All-State Team.
- that Lincoln Park has the oldest officially credentialed International Baccalaureate program in Illinois. Seventy-six students earned the IB Diploma in May, 2000: 94% of the senior candidates (the worldwide average is 75%). Many Lincoln Park

teachers instruct teachers internationally in IB courses and methods. The average number of points earned on the exam was 33 (24 points are required for the diploma). Four students scored over 40 points. IB students come from over 25 countries.

- that of the 30 projects sent to the Chicago Metro History Fair this year from LPHS, 24 were chosen to go to the Illinois State History Fair. In Springfield, we had more superior ratings than any other school in the state. Five of the ten projects that were chosen for the national competition were from Lincoln Park.
- that twenty-two percent of the students chosen to go to the State Science Fair and State Symposium this year were from LPHS (12 of the 56 chosen from the entire city). Two of the four who advanced to the International Science Fair were Lincoln Park Lions.
- that three LPHS 2000 graduates were named semifinalists in the Intel National Science Talent Search (formerly the Westinghouse Talent Search), which is the oldest and most highly regarded science competition. Only five high school students were named from the entire state of Illinois, and no other school had multiple winners.
- that an American Chemical Society award for the highest scoring student in the annual scholarship examination went to a Lincoln Park sophomore.
- that LPHS has an award-winning student newspaper, The Lion's Roar! This year members of the staff were recognized in two categories of the contest sponsored by the Illinois Woman's Press Association: Single Page Layout (3rd place) and Editorial (honorable mention).
- that LPHS musicians again received many superior and excellent ratings in city and state competitions for band and orchestra, solos and ensembles in 1999-2000. Both the Concert Band

- and the Orchestra once again won Division I Superior ratings. Lincoln Park's Chorus, Mixed Ensemble and Girls' Ensemble earned Superior awards in city competition; the Madrigals earned an Honors Superior.
- that 21 LPHS French students placed in the Top Ten in Illinois in the AATF (American Association of Teachers of French) exam to test foreign language aptitude. This was more than any other high school in the state except New Trier, which includes a junior high. They were honored in a ceremony in May at Dominican University in River Forest.
 - that a LPHS drama student has become a regular cast member of "Tina and Tony's Wedding", a long running play at Piper's Alley.
 - that for the second year in a row, two LPHS freshmen students won the Indo-American Center Essay Competition discussing the historical contributions of Martin Luther King and Mohandas K. Gandhi.
 - that the 2000 LPHS math team won third place in the City of Chicago Tournament, vying with over 60 teams.



- that the Academic Decathlon team won second place in the city, after winning the Region 2 competition. The team competed in the state meet with three replacement members due to conflicts with the Science Symposium and History Fair, but they took fourth place anyway!
- that the school has 36 extracurricular clubs, plus 47 teams for 13 sports participating in athletic competition.
- that 92% of LPHS students attend college after graduation. This year, LPHS seniors chose numerous competitive colleges and universities for continuing academic study: for example, three are currently at Stanford, four at the University of Wisconsin, two at Dartmouth, two at Johns Hopkins, two at Vassar, four at the University of Chicago, three at Northwestern, two at McGill, and one each at Pomona, California Institute of Technology, Wellesley, Brown, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Smith and Mt. Holyoke

SPORTS NEWS

- that the boys' basketball team were undefeated champions of the North Section Conference in 1999-2000, where Coach McGinnis was named Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year. The Lions advanced to the third round of the Chicago Public League playoffs. We wish them the best this year!



- that the girls' varsity soccer team completed their conference season with a perfect 9-0 record in the Chicago Public League premier division. For the second year in a row, they lost to Whitney Young in vying for the city title, taking second.
- that both varsity and sophomore boys volleyball teams capped winning seasons with playoff victories, winning city championship titles. The sophomore victory over Lane Tech bodes well for the future!
- that in girls' cross country this fall, LPHS runners took first by far, in city competition!
- that the girls' tennis team lost to Kenwood by only two points, placing second among CPS teams. Three singles players and two doubles teams contributed to this accomplishment.

FACULTY NEWS AND COMMUNITY & WORLD OUTREACH

- Friends of the Chicago River honored nine LPHS science teachers as its Teachers of the Year for 2000. They were recognized for a project started by Carol Widegren and Edwin Metzl that now engages hundreds of students every year in using the river as a laboratory for science studies. Students study the river's chemistry and biology with a field trip to collect water quality and habitat data.
- Over the past year, seven LPHS teachers attended seminars at the Newberry Library for a program entitled "Teachers As Scholars." This innovative program is designed to nourish research interests in English, science, and social studies of CPS teachers. It also is designed to enhance teacher academic performance through provision of challenging and interesting topics, and to provide personal and professional encouragement. An LPHS alumna who teaches at Kenwood Academy, Charisse Neal (86), has also been a participant of the program for two years.

- Mrs. Janis Todd, principal of LPHS, has been an early and strong supporter of "Teachers as Scholars" (see above), providing wise advice and consistent encouragement. This program can have a strong impact on Chicago education as it expands to more teachers.
- Lincoln Park has a sister school, Christianeum Gymnasium, in Hamburg, Germany. Students from each school have exchanged visits for three years. Another relationship is developing with a school in Casablanca, Morocco, as LPHS families hosted students from Groupe Scolaire Le Cedre this past March. Our students, along with students from Abraham Lincoln Elementary, plan to travel there during Spring Break this year.
- Volunteer community service involves many students at LPHS. Over 30 students were at Muscular Dystrophy /Horizon Camp this summer. Twenty students did a Lincoln Park-run Habitat for Humanity in Indiana. Students volunteer as peer tutors in the school and outside, at the Anti-Cruelty Society, at Park District camps, at area hospitals and at service projects in Kentucky, the Caribbean and Mexico.
- The University of Chicago Graduate School of Business Alumni Group has formed a partnership with LPHS to offer workshops, networking, and mentoring opportunities to highly motivated students.
- this year LPHS has 4 Golden Apple Nominees: Eric Young, Maureen Breen, Jane Campbell and Ross Frellick. Four teachers have been named to Who's Who in Teachers: Ron Smith, David Ritter, Marie Aragon and Helmut Stefan.
- on October 11, four students performed in the Jazz in the Schools Mentor Program sponsored by the Ravinia Festival, at the Harold Washington Library.
- Governor and Mrs. George Ryan were at LPHS in October, as part of the McDonald Corporation Founder's Week activities. The corporation honored Mrs. Ryan's volunteer efforts in support of children. As part of the spirit of volunteerism, more than fifty McDonald's corporate workers completed two needed projects at the school: they painted the wrought iron fences in the front of the school and cleared the underbrush in the Freshman Atrium. Ronald McDonald even joined in the fun. In addition, McDonald's Corporation has provided our growing band with \$11,000 that will be used to purchase some greatly needed new band uniforms and refurbish old ones.
- that computer classes continue to be offered to LPHS staff & community, including senior citizens. Call 773-534-8130, ext. 318, for information about times and topics.
