## WALLER/LPHS ALUMNI ASSOCIATION “REBORN”

On January 22, 2001, twenty alumni, a parent and a spouse of alumni and several faculty (both current and retired) met at Lincoln Park High to form a new Alumni Association. The first matter of business was to approve Bylaws. A draft was presented and revisions were made to the draft. One highlight of the approved Bylaws/Constitution was that not only would the new organization be open for membership to alumni and attendees of the school, but also to parents, spouses and siblings of alumni, as well as former and current faculty and staff and any other friends of the school.

Other important items specified: the annual meeting will be held in October of each year, and all members may vote at the annual meeting if his/her dues were paid during the preceding and/or current year. Annual dues will be determined by the Board of Directors. Officers will serve for two-year terms, board members for one-year terms.

Association officers elected were William "Bill" Leaveck (class of 1954), Rodney Randall-Vice President (class of 1960), Diane (Fritz) Peters-Recording Secretary (class of 1955), Pat (Cieloha)

Novakowski-Corresponding Secretary (class of 1954), and Maretta Jeuland-Treasurer (parent of two alumni of 1997 and 1999).

Board members elected were Mead Gifford (class of 1953), Wally Heistad (class of 1954), James Kimura (class of 1944), Bill Rossberger (class of 1948), Bernice (Stevo) Schweichler (class of 1935) and Glenn Washington (class of 1971). Also elected were former faculty members Elston Elston and Marna Shapiro, as well as alumna spouse Dale Peters and Phyllis Wright, current Assistant Principal of Lincoln Park High.

At meetings of Board members on March 28 and April 25, several committees were formed. A Mission Committee made up of Mead Gifford, Dale Peters and Glen Washington formulated a mission statement (see page 8) for the organization, which was approved. The Alumni Relations committee (for facilitating reunions, etc.) is chaired by Wally Heistad. The Publicity/Communications Committee will be responsible for the *Alumni News* publication, and a Finance Committee will oversee budget and funds.

Little did members of the graduation class of June 1941 realize that six months later they, along with millions of other Americans, would be at war and our lives would be changed forever.

After Pearl Harbor, I entered the Navy V-5 Pilot Training Program and after completing a pre-flight program volunteered to attend the Navigation School in Florida. Upon graduating, I was assigned to the crew of a PB4Y (Liberator) Photograph Squadron that was based on Guadalcanal in the South Pacific Area. Our crew flew many long-range missions which usually lasted twelve to sixteen hours. My squadron, V-D1, photographed many enemy installations for the first time. After completing that tour of duty, I returned to the United States and completed my pilot training.

I tried several occupations after returning to civilian life and finally settled down at the DoAll Company from which I retired after 30 years, working my way up to the position of Group Product Manager of Abrasive Products.

My wife Shirley and I will be married forty-nine years this year. We moved to McHenry six years ago to be near Shirley's family. We do not have children so we spend much of our time with her sister and brother-in-law and their children. I play golf as often as possible and enjoy it even if I am a duffer. I am also interested in genealogy, have traced my roots back to 1800 and am still looking.

## EDITORIAL

On January 22, 2001, the Waller/Lincoln Park High School Alumni Association was born, comprised of graduates from both Lincoln Park High School and its predecessor Waller High. For 34 years, graduates have had no formal mechanism for reminiscing with other graduates regarding the "old days", no outlet for that famous (?) school spirit. We're happy that this situation has been remedied!

The first association, which existed from 1931 to 1967, sponsored banquet dinners, talent shows and plays. The annual event of the year was the Homecoming Dance, with the election of a Homecoming Queen. These social events helped to raise money for college scholarships for students.

The immediate, overriding goal of OUR new association is to rally all graduates to support it. WE NEED YOU to become members and to renew memberships annually: we do request that memberships be renewed in September each year. We also hope to have your support at events that are organized for alumni--such as the newly inaugurated Holiday Reception in December and the Annual Alumni Day, which happens during an important school open house each year.

Another long-term goal is to support the school and its current students. Already we are planning to give a \$500 award to a deserving graduating senior this June. This has been made possible because of contributions by more than 65 of you to the Alumni Scholarship Fund, first established at the time of the school Centennial celebration in 1999. We hope that this fund will continue to receive contributions and that by June 2002, this amount will have increased to allow more and bigger awards.

We do plan to continue to publish regular newsletters for alumni. We have published seven issues of the *Alumni News* since the fall of 1997 (but only one during the 1999-2000 school year, because of a slowing of contributions and membership renewals). It is important that graduates be kept in contact with each other and with school happenings. However, the printing and mailing of each new issue of the *Alumni News* costs from \$2000 and \$2600, depending on its size. Until now, alumni dues have entirely paid for it, and it is obvious that everyone appreciates the special publication you are now holding.

But we will need more funds if we want to be able to finance additional alumni events and mailings and also to support the school with occasional funds to help provide for certain important program needs. We may eventually need to increase membership dues in order to finance such additional activities. It all depends on the level of support we have from YOU!

Currently, the new association is working toward becoming a corporation with federal tax-exempt status. When this process is completed, we may be able to sponsor events such as dances and banquets--for the purpose of furthering alumni contacts and raising needed funds.

Money is not the only issue of concern, however. We would like to see more recent graduates actively involved in the Board of Directors and committees. Of the fifteen officers and board members, the oldest graduated in 1935, the two youngest in 1960 and 1971. We definitely need more involvement from graduates from the 1960's, 1970's, 1980's and 1990's. All are welcome! Remember: our meetings are held on the last Wednesday of the month at Lincoln Park High at 7:00 p.m., monthly except June, July, December and January.

Until we meet again, remember that each dollar you give goes toward publication of the *Alumni News*, other mailings and (if you so designate) to the Alumni Scholarship Fund. We sincerely thank you for your support!

The Robert A. Waller/Lincoln Park High School Alumni Scholarship Fund was discussed also. Interest accumulated since April of 1999 plus an individual donation will make possible a first award of \$500 to a graduating senior in June of 2001, to be used for furthering his/her education. Four criteria to be met by the awardee(s) were determined as follows: the student must have attended LPHS during all four years of high school, the student must have a good record (i.e. in citizenship, leadership and service), there must be financial need, and the student must provide evidence of enrollment at a particular college or technical school in the fall following graduation.

Until the Articles of Incorporation have been officially approved by the State of Illinois and until official non-profit status is established, the Association will continue to operate under the "umbrella" of Friends of Lincoln Park High School, which keeps alumni funds separate. It is hoped that by the fall of 2001, the Association will be independent. Until then, membership and donation checks should continue to go to "Friends of LPHS/Alumni". Yearlong memberships should be renewed each September.

Researching the activities and structures of other active high school alumni associations in the Chicago area are planned for the future.

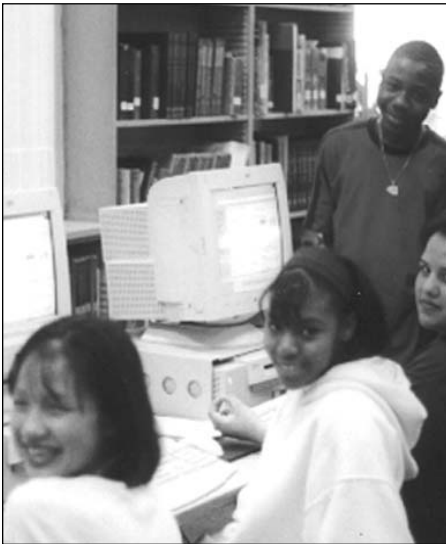

# READING & MATH TUTORING THROUGH GLOBAL LEARNING PARTNERS



TECHNOLOGY IN ACTION

Are you aware of a new tutoring effort that is going on at LPHS? This year, LPHS received a Technology Literacy Challenge Fund grant, resulting in \$90,000 for our school. This grant extended the ongoing Americare Brazil cultural exchange grant project directed by Virginia Eichinger, Technology Coordinator.

The major goal of this grant was to undertake to improve the math and reading performance of the "neediest" students (as evidenced in standardized test scores in reading and math). The grant writers, school librarian Michaeline Rojek and consultant Maretta Jeuland, envisioned a peer-tutoring program in which underclassmen would work with older students who would serve as tutors/mentors, using computers and software to provide extra practice in the targeted subjects. The project—coordinated by Mrs. Rojek and assisted by teachers, Mrs. Jeuland and student volunteer tutors—allowed the tutors to earn community service hours for giving their time.

A second goal of the grant (termed "Global Learning Partners") was to work with a school or schools in foreign countries to do cultural/academic exchanges via the Internet. Our foreign language teachers have been quite excited about the potential for e-mail communication

between classrooms of our students learning French, Spanish or German and classrooms of students in a foreign country learning English. For this phase of the project, students in one French II class sent and received messages with students in Nice, France, at Collège de l'Estérel. Another French II class communicated with students at the Lycée International Honoré de Balzac in Paris.

In addition, a long-term goal of actually sharing student work in world literature, the sciences, history and the arts is being developed by a Global Learning Partners team of 15 LPHS teachers. They are currently working on several curriculum-related projects that will soon be made operational. Some students in the Information Technology in a Global Society class are in the process of developing websites to share these projects.

Motivated students and teacher teams from LPHS and other international schools thus hope to find many innovative, productive ways to do/share learning projects cooperatively using the Internet. In fact, the Kanazu Senior High School in Kanazu, Japan, has recently begun corresponding with us in regard to long-term possibilities!

As an ongoing, necessary third focus of the grant, Mrs. Rojek has also organized a series of on-site technology

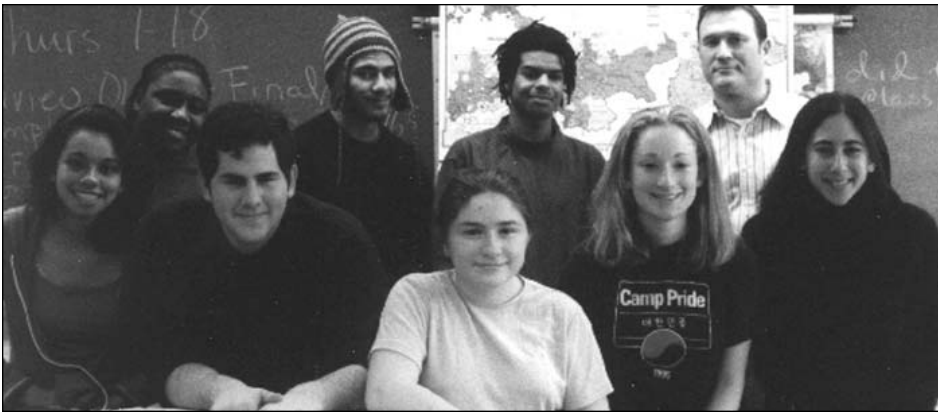
classes for LPHS faculty and staff. She has sought and hired experts who have been introducing staff and students (Computer Corps members) to important computer skills and software: for example, Microsoft Word, Excel, Powerpoint, Access, Adobe Photoshop, Pagemaker, Dreamweaver and Imageready, digital photography, Front Page and deep Web searching. Training has been scheduled weekly, was also available through STAR online, and could sometimes be arranged to accommodate busy staff schedules on a one-on-one basis. In addition, the members of the Global Learning Partners team have received Castle Technologies online course training in ways to use the Internet in their classrooms. They also attended several related technology conferences and workshops outside of school.

*Michaeline Rojek, as the inspired coordinator of this vast and ambitious grant project, deserves major recognition and gratitude! Her efforts to create teamwork for this effort have drawn together individuals (faculty and students) from all LPHS academic programs. She is a determined, visionary educator, tirelessly dedicated to the students of LPHS—and is definitely contributing to our goal of being an internationally-oriented high school.*

## Alumni Social Events Sponsored

On December 21, 2000, a **Holiday Reception** for alumni was held. Many recent graduates (1997-2000) returned to the school for this event and were able to see former classmates and teachers at the same time. We hope to see more of the school's graduates for this event next year during the holidays!

On March 14, 2001, the **2nd Annual Alumni Day** saw only a handful of graduates in attendance at the LPHS Middlemarch Open House. Students were on hand to take alumni on tours of the school this year, but the fact that the reception for graduates was scheduled for the same time as the most interesting student performances was unfortunate. We resolve to do better next year!

### Student Activities, Honors and Recognition

There are now 36 clubs and activities in addition to sports options at LPHS. Here is a partial list: Academic Decathlon, African-American Achievers, Amnesty International, Asian Culture Club, Aspira, BASIC (Brothers and Sisters in Christ), Chess, Chinese Culture Club, Computer Club, Computer Corps, Crew, Drama Club, Ecology Club, French Club, Gardening Club, German Club, Interact (Rotary International), JAY (Jewish American Youth), Jazz Band, Key Club (Kiwans International), Math Team, Mock Trial Competition, Muslim Youth of Chicago, National Honor Society, Newspaper (Lions' Roar), Physics Club, Polish Heritage Club, Romanian Club, Service Peer Leadership, Spanish Club, Student Council, Web Designers, Yearbook.

### Music and Drama

Five members of the LPHS Orchestra were selected to participate in the Illinois Music Educators Association Orchestra. In the city-wide orchestra competition, LPHS musicians received scores that placed them above all other orchestras in Chicago. Judges were "impressed with the quality of the music and even "surprised" that a high school group could play music at that level. The Concert Band continued its tradition of high, first-place ratings under new director Pawlowski.

At the March State and City Solo and Ensemble Festivals, the Mixed Ensemble and the Madrigal received Superior and Honors Superior ratings. Seven students received Superior vocal medals for solo performances.

Each year, LPHS senior drama majors direct one-act plays, which are performed matinees and evenings over several weeks. Music, comedy and melodrama were all in the mix this year and reflected the great talent of our drama students.

### Academic Competitions

**Anne Korenblit** (01) was selected one of 300 semifinalists for the nationwide Intel Science Talent Search for her project on Regulation of Nitrate Reductase Activity: Manipulation of Magnesium and Hydrogen Ion Concentration. She and the school will each receive \$1,000.

**Sarah Weiss** (01) was named "honorable mention" semi-finalist in the Siemens

Westinghouse Science Competition.

Thirteen of the fifty students chosen at the City Science Fair (March 31) to advance to the Illinois State Science Fair were from LPHS. Two of them were among four who were selected city-wide to compete in the International Science and Engineering Fair, held in May in San Jose, California.

The LPHS Academic Decathlon Team of 9 students finished 6th at the Illinois State Competition in March. They had placed a close 3rd at the Regional and a tough 4th at the City Competitions. At most other high schools, team members actually take an "Acadec" class, but at LPHS this is not done, so the students must add the extensive study and preparation time required to all their other lessons and extracurricular activities. These results reflect their sheer dedication and ambition! We congratulate them!

Members of the Math Team performed outstandingly in two recent competitions. They placed second in the Chicago City Mathematics League competition, with three students scoring the highest total points in their categories. Also advancing to the State level in the contest sponsored by the Illinois Council of Teachers of Mathematics were the junior/senior team, the Geometry team, and several members of the Algebra team.

Twenty-three of thirty projects advanced to City History Fair Finals: nine papers, seven performances and six exhibits. We had sent ten projects in each category to the district level.

The LPHS "Know Your Heritage" Team completed a successful and award-winning year. In their second season of competition, the five-person team made it to the finals of this challenging multicultural quiz show.

### International Week Activities

During the week of April 9-13, students engaged in several activities. On Tuesday, there was an "Open Mic" poetry and cultural storytelling session after school. On Wednesday evening, many LPHS students, parents and teachers met to share a delightful international potluck dinner, with dishes from Tibetan, Chinese, Filipino, German, Jewish, Greek, Polish, Mexican, Korean and American cultures. Participants were also treated to a fashion show highlighting German, Greek, West African and Tibetan fashions. These events were planned by the LPHS branch of the National Conference for Community and Justice. An International Dance was slated for May 11.

Twenty-five LPHS seniors took exams in a non-English language in order to qualify for International Baccalaureate bilingual diplomas this year. Languages tested were Chinese, Dutch, Filipino, French, German, Greek, Korean, Polish, Romanian, Russian, Spanish, and Turkish.

### College Destinations

LPHS graduating seniors have been accepted at many fine universities this year: among them Amherst, Bates, Boston University, Brown, Cal Tech, Carleton, Cornell, Dartmouth, Duke, Harvard, Harvey Mudd, Johns Hopkins, McGill, MIT, Middlebury, Northwestern, Penn, Pomona, Smith, Stanford, Swarthmore, Tufts, U of California-Berkeley, U of Chicago, Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin-Madison, Vassar, Wellesley, Yale.

### Distinguished Visitor

Outgoing **Secretary of State Madeleine Albright** met on Wednesday, January 17 with a group of LPHS juniors and seniors. She asked to meet with students from the International Baccalaureate program, and she answered a wide range of questions about international affairs and her career as a scholar and public official. Many of those present came to Chicago from the very parts of the world where the Secretary has worked for peace during her years in office. At the request of the State Department, there was no advance publicity and security was tight.

### Faculty News

**Fred Jordan** was inducted posthumously into the Illinois High School Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame. Fred is said to have "resurrected" the football program at Chicago Waller High School. During the 24 years he was the head coach, Fred's trademark was to always go the extra mile for those with whom he worked. He won the Northwest Blue Division four times, finished unbeaten twice and was the first in the conference to defeat long-time power Sullivan. Various groups honored him for his efforts over the years.

Many are sad that English teacher James Gibbons retired in February 2001. He will be missed by many students who enjoyed his fresh way of looking at both literature and life and by many teaching colleagues as well.

### Community Connections and Outreach

The Community-Wide Forum Project sponsored by Children's Memorial Hospital continues to make progress in its efforts to focus attention on ways to improve our school. At a public meeting in January attended by Paul Vallas and 43rd Ward Alderman Vi Daley, subcommittees reported on their work during the first half of the year. Extended library hours are a result of the plan formulated by the Study Hall and Library Subcommittee. A Job Resources Subcommittee has hosted classes and a workshop on resumé writing and job interviewing, plus they have published a brochure to help students. The External Affairs Subcommittee has a plan for publicizing the school and has recommended establishing part-time positions for a staff member and a student, to coordinate public relations. Mr. Vallas has promised a

stipend for the staff position, as well as other stipends. It is now up to the school and community to find ways to turn this one-year effort into an ongoing one with permanent results that benefit all in the school community.

April marked the end of an exciting year of theater-going for LPHS drama majors. Juniors attended an exciting array of new plays, courtesy of our neighbors at Victory Gardens Theater. Seniors saw three shows as part of the Goodman Theater's student subscription series.

On March 1, one hundred fourteen French students of all levels attended Rossini's opera "The Barber of Seville" at the Lyric Opera House, which offers each year a student opera at a reasonable price. Before attending, the students were prepared by a member of the education department of the Lyric, who gave a presentation to all of them. The experience was a wonderful blend of art, language, music, history and theater.

Charlie Trotter, famous chef, has hosted LPHS students in his restaurant on several occasions recently. Cross country runners, National Honor Society members, and special needs students along with those interested in culinary arts were among those honored with invitations to experience 7-course dinners, as reward for outstanding effort or achievement in a particular way.

### Travel

On April 12, fifteen students, six teachers and Mrs. Todd left for Morocco to visit Le Cèdre School in Casablanca (a Chicago Sister City). Before leaving, our students

met weekly to learn about cultural differences so that they would act correctly in an Islamic country. After spending two days sightseeing in Fez (the most intact medieval city in North Africa) the travelers stayed with French- and Arabic-speaking families in Casablanca, visited classes in the school, participated in sports, and were treated to a party in the home of the school principal. They gave a short presentation to their hosts concerning our school, Chicago and the United States. They also rode a camel and visited the famous Ourika market in Marrakech and saw the capital city of Rabat. Because all was provided for the Moroccan students when they came here last year, the only cost for the travelers was the airfare to Morocco. What a fascinating and enjoyable trip to a totally different culture!

Ten LPHS students and German teacher Mr. Stefan participated in this year's annual Chicago-Hamburg Sister City exchange. All lived with German families, meeting every morning at the Christianeum Gymnasium (host school in Hamburg). A variety of activities were planned: classroom visitations, visits to Hamburg's art gallery and a TV station, tours of the harbor and DASA (Airbus Industries), reception in city hall, backstage tour of Hamburg Opera and performance of Verdi's "A Masked Ball", visits to the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp and the medieval town of Celle, plus a 2-day trip to Berlin where the travelers saw many more sights. The students also presented a talent show/literary evening with poetry, skits and musical numbers for their hosts.
